I believe I have learned the true fundamentals of graphic design through each design class. Each class in this degree program has helped me build confidence through the discipline of learning how to use design technology and creating projects that have challenged me to think outside of the box. I am confident the creative work I have learned to produce will help me succeed into my professional future.

This capstone course truly opened my eyes to how I can be a great graphic designer if I want to be. The process and timing of this capstone project opened my eyes to truly seeing how long your work can take to produce the best possible content. I was given ample feedback throughout my coursework at SNHU to make my portfolio design work the best it can be. Each week brought a different critique depending on the work I was revising or creating from scratch to put into my portfolio. In week three of this capstone course, I was given

feedback to change a few aspects of the revised pieces I chose to keep in my portfolio. These critiques included changing the color palettes, fixing the alignment of my design pieces, changing the depth (bold) of a specific font, and making sure the resolutions are up to par for the photographs I have chosen to include in my work. I took this feedback in week three and applied it to each piece which ended up making my work better overall. In week five, I was given good feedback to help finalize the new and original pieces I have created to finalize my portfolio. I enjoyed this critique process because it felt like the process that could potentially happen in a professional setting. I was given design suggestions for my Ocean City, New Jersey advertisement and where to place the photograph as well as using one quote in my overall design (instead of two quotes). I originally had a bus advertisement idea, so the ad was dividing on to two sides with a photograph in the middle. I chose to change it to a poster design, making it more cohesive. The final design included adding one quote to make sure the consumers attention was focused on properly. A similar critique was given for my Philadelphia Zoo billboard design. I was told to change the size of my font and to shorten the quote to make sure the consumer can read the billboard in its entirety when passing it on the road. These critiques helped me perfect my portfolio work that can be seen on my portfolio website and my print portfolio. The collaboration aspect of creating my portfolio was extremely important to gain a sense of how the consumer world views my work. Without collaboration, you cannot work on a team properly, especially in the design world. Overall, I know that without critique and collaboration, the creative process would not be successful in any environment.

I have learned a great deal of important knowledge and skills to help me produce professional content in the future. These skills are already being proven true with the ability to apply for new jobs and receiving job interviews in that process. Not only will I be prepared for the next step of my professional life, but it also gives me the overall ability to repeat the portfolio design process in the future when I produce and update my work to continue with my professional career. Each class I have taken has given my ample knowledge and skills I can build upon in the future to grow as a professional. I feel like I have the basic set of skills I need to move forward into a new job and career. I believe that professional designers need to continuously develop themselves as professionals. Designers should be willing to always learn more technologically and professionally with each step they take in their careers. It also is evident that each class taken in our degree program was a step closer to this portfolio course. We have been given skills to create design pieces that can professionally make you stand out in the crowd. In the future, I plan to use the skills I have learned and move forwards in hopes to continue my education and professional life by learning as much as I can to become the best graphic designer I can be.
